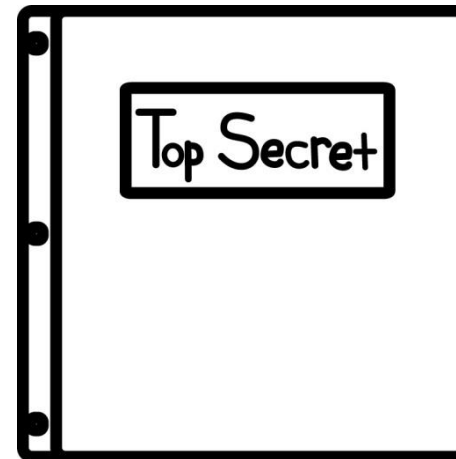

How Important is Reading?

When your child asks, "Do I have to read
tonight?" Here are some things to consider before
you answer.

- If a child reads one minute a day then they
will have read approximately 8,000 words by
the end of the school year.
- If a child reads five minutes a day then they
will have read approximately 282,000 words
by the end of the school year.
- If a child reads 20 minutes a day then they
will have read approximately 1,800,000 words
by the end of the school year.
